
## Post COVID-19 — What's next for higher education design?

Over 150 attendees joined an international online debate hosted by Make Architects and HEDQF to launch Make's new Exchange publication. Looking at the future design of higher education buildings and campuses we considered:

- What trends are emerging in each region, and how can estates adapt and change in the aftermath of COVID-19?
